The Psalms of Ascents

Week 8 – Friday Psa. 132:13-18

After God's dwelling place was established, the ark rested in the temple and the kingdom of David was also established. The result is the blessings that God gives man. Psalm 132, verses13 to 18 say, "For the LORD has chosen Zion; He has desired it for His dwelling place: 'This is My resting place forever; Here I will dwell, for I have desired it. I will abundantly bless her provision; I will satisfy her poor with bread. I will also clothe her priests with salvation, And her saints shall shout aloud for joy. There I will make the horn of David grow; I will prepare a lamp for My Anointed. His enemies I will clothe with shame, But upon Himself His crown shall flourish.'" This is the conclusion of this section. It is filled with God's provisions, God's blessings.

Verse 13 says, "For the LORD has chosen Zion; He has desired it for His dwelling place." Zion is where God wields power, and God has chosen Zion as His dwelling place, according to His desire. God said, "This is My resting place forever; Here I will dwell, for I have desired it" (v. 14). How joyful! Who is living in the church today? The Lord. Who is in power? The Lord. Who is reality? The Lord. Who is powerful? The Lord. In the church life, we cannot see anything else, but Christ and always Christ. This is a beautiful picture with the church built up with Christ in its midst. The kingdom of Christ is established and He is ruling. We see nothing else but Christ and always Christ.

Psalm 132, verses 15 through 18 say, "I will abundantly bless her provision; I will satisfy her poor with bread. I will also clothe her priests with salvation, And her saints shall shout aloud for joy. There I will make the horn of David grow; I will prepare a lamp for My Anointed. His enemies I will clothe with shame, But upon Himself His crown shall flourish." We should rejoice and be happy! When the Lord has gained His dwelling place and His testimony according to His power, His blessing will be abundant. At this time, the spiritual provisions in the church life will be abundant (v. 15). Those who are fighting for the Lord and who are servants of the Lord, or who are responsible for the brethren, are now covered with salvation-oh, what a salvation! This is the blessing they have gained by standing firm for the testimony of the Lord (v. 16). At the same time, it is no longer, "And let Your saints shout for joy" (v. 9), but "And her saints shall shout aloud for joy" (v. 16). The Lord's victory is to be manifested in the testimony of the church, and the Lord Himself is to be manifested by the church (v. 17). The enemies of the Lord shall be humiliated and feel ashamed, and the crown of the Lord's head shall shine brightly to illuminate and enlighten all, and the Lord's power shall radiate brilliantly on the surface of the entire earth (v. 18).
